

(Civil Engg.) of CSPIT faced with a fatal accident on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2019 after office hours at Karoli Cross Road, Changa. **Ms. Mauna Patel of PDPIAS** had timely shifted him to Charusat Hospital in her car. Because of this Mr. Ashish's life is stable now.

There had been several ill-fortunate accidents recently and also in the past. Charusat family members have been severely hurt, and few have lost lives. This is very unfortunate and sad. To avoid a recurrence of such incidents, you are requested to counsel your students as under:

- Wear HELMET while driving a two-wheeler.
- Use Seat Belt while driving a CAR.
- Do not commute in overload vehicles
- Travel early to avoid the rush.
- Do not overhang on the vehicle in which you are commuting to campus or any other places.
- Use the right side of the road (Ideally Footpath) while walking in any direction.
- Do not walk in groups on the Road to avoid blockage of Roads, even in night timings.
- Do not walk or drive a vehicle while listening to music or talking on the phone.
- ALWAYS follow the traffic rules to have safe driving.
- Do not over speed.
- Do not use mobile phone while driving and walking on road.



## **Minutes:**

### **1. Regarding University functioning during lockdown 5.0/Unlock 1.0**

Considering the latest Government directives regarding Covid-19. You may take note as under:

1. All the employees of your institute/department shall be called upon to join duties from 04-06-2020 (Thursday). Those employees residing in the containment zone/micro containment zone shall continue to work from home. Information regarding the same shall be provided to the HR Section for record purposes.
2. The University and its constituent institutes shall be working in normal working hours.
3. All employees shall follow the preventive measures at the workplace as per guidelines attached.
4. All the employees shall be involved in relevant work like admission duty, Laboratory upkeep and maintenance, preparation of online teaching materials, preparation of next semester teaching, exams, quality improvement, enhancement of pedagogy, Introduction of Basic Sciences, Research, Project proposal submission, Remedial coaching, tutorials, taking domain relevant courses, compilation of data for IQAC etc.

### **2. Regarding Office Timing and Leave Administration - Flexi timing**

Charusat has introduced Flexi timing from 01.09.2020. This shall give sufficient flexibility to teachers to pursue their academic as well as research activities.

The following points have to be considered while availing the Flexi timing facility to staff members (Teaching and Non-Teaching Cadre):

1. Work-hours per day shall be a minimum of 7.30 hours including a half-hour lunch break. Total work hours per week shall not be less than 42 hours.
2. All academic assignments like lectures/laboratories etc. as per institutional time-table shall have to be diligently adhered to. Any discrepancy in that shall be construed as misconduct.
3. Every working day from 11:00 am to 03:00 pm shall be core timing where all staff members shall be available.
4. It is necessary for all the employees to register the fingerprint impression every day for both the time to avoid any discrepancies. If the system finds a single time punch or No punch of any employee then the system will mark CL /LWP.
5. It is absolutely necessary to apply for leave in e-Governance within 3 days of the first day of leave. Failing which his/her leave will be considered as CL / LWP.
6. For the presence of half-day, the presence of four hours' time duration is required.
7. Provision of early going and late coming relaxation for two times in a month will not be applicable henceforth because of Flexi timings.

### **3. Regarding work pattern due to Covid 19.**

Due to sudden rise in the Covid situation at Gujarat and nearby areas of university, looking to the safety of the staff members including teaching non-teaching and attendant staff we would

like to request the respective Principals, Deans and HoDs to take the decision to call the teaching and non-teaching staff to institute or give work from home. We accept the decisions from the respective authorities. All decisions should be communicated through email to the Registrar and copying the HR Section CHARUSAT.

#### **4. Appeal to help students during Covid 19 Pandemic situation**

The Employees are requested to take care of their selves and their family members during this pandemic situation. Also, by looking into the current situation of COVID all the teacher counselors are requested to contact the students of their respective departments frequently. These should be taken care as part of counselling activities, to know about the well-being of students and any difficulties in their study.

Also, as a CHARUSAT family member we all should come together at the department/institute level and extend the best possible help to the students in their wellbeing, studies and other support. Kindly, remember our existence are interconnected so all including students, employees and all other staff members associated with CHARUSAT are important and has to be safe both mentally and physically.

#### **5. To strictly follow COVID-19 protocol**

All the staff members are requested to wear the ID Card during office hours and to prevent the flare of COVID-19, It is compulsory to wear face mask.

You may note that violation of the above will be considered as an act of indiscipline and strict disciplinary actions shall be taken against such employees. They will have to deposit a fine up to Rs.500/- against violation of the said guidelines.

**Post Lockdown Guidelines  
of COVID-19**

## **Preamble**

COVID – 19 is an acute respiratory illness caused by a novel human corona virus (SARS-CoV-2, called COVID – 19 virus), which causes higher mortality in people aged  $\geq 60$  years and in people with underlying medical conditions such as cardiovascular disease, chronic respiratory disease, diabetes and cancer. COVID – 19 has spread to majority of countries in the world and caused huge number of fatality. The following post lockdown guidelines was developed in congruence with available guidelines of WHO, MHFW, MHRD Government of India, and ICMR to be institute to reduce the spread and control of COVID – 19 disease. The purpose of this document is to provide post lockdown guidelines of COVID – 19 for public.

To maintain health safety against the ongoing Coronary Viral Diseases – 2019 (Covid-19) pandemic situation, every member entering in the CHARUSAT campus has to mandatory measures. The working people and visitors to CHARUSAT shall have three different categories

1. Staying in the Campus
2. Daily commuters
3. Visitors

## **Following are the general rules to be followed by everyone on daily basis**

### **Entering into campus**

- While entering into the campus, face covering with the mask is must. With the mask on the face only be allowed in the campus
- Body temperature check is must for everyone on daily basis
- Before entering to campus, everyone need to pass through hygienic tunnel

### **Hand hygiene:**

- Wash hands frequently and thoroughly with soap/hand wash liquid and water (for minimum 40 – 60 seconds) or use alcohol based hand sanitizer(for minimum 20 – 40 seconds), even when hands are visibly clean
- Wash your hands frequently with help of soap and water (after coughing and sneezing, after using toilet, before cooking, after cooking and before eating, before and after caring sick person)



**Respiratory hygiene:** Every member in the campus must have to

- Cover the mouth and nose with mask, tissue paper, hand kerchief, sleeves or elbow while coughing or sneezing otherwise always too
- Avoid touching mouth, nose, eyes or ears
- Throw the used tissues, masks in a covered dust bin and wash the hands
- Clean/disinfect the frequently touched surfaces like door knobs, switch boards, desk tops, key board, table, chair, cupboard, hand railing, phones with proper sanitizer
- Report to authority if they have signs and symptoms like fever, cough and difficulty in breathing
- Avoid spit or shout in public places to avoid the spread of droplets.

**Physical distancing and movement restriction**

In current pandemic situation, physical distancing is the best solution to fight against Covid-19. Every members and students in the campus must follow physical distance with the following practices;

- Must restrict the daily contact
  - Must maintain physical distancing and keep at least 1 meter distance (in public place or at workplace)
  - Must avoid touching of others
  - Must avoid crowding in the campus
  - Must have to avoid the movement in the campus

Dear All,

You are aware that Charusat has introduced Flexi timing from 01.09.2020. This shall give sufficient flexibility to teachers to pursue their academic as well as research activities.

**The following points have to be considered while availing the Flexi timing facility to staff members (Teaching and Non Teaching Cadre) :**

1. Work-hours per day shall be a minimum of 7.30 hours including a half-hour lunch break. Total work hours per week shall not be less than 42 hours.
2. All academic assignments like lectures/laboratories etc. as per institutional time-table shall have to be diligently adhered to. Any discrepancy in that shall be construed as misconduct.
3. Every working day from 11:00 am to 03:00 pm shall be core timing where all staff members shall be available.
4. It is necessary for all the employees to register the fingerprint impression every day for both the time to avoid any discrepancies. If the system finds a single time punch or No punch of any employee then the system will mark CL /LWP.
5. It is absolutely necessary to apply for leave in e-Governance within 3 days of the first day of leave. Failing which his/her leave will be considered as CL / LWP.
6. For the presence of half-day, the presence of four hours' time duration is required.
7. Provision of early going and late coming relaxation for two times in a month will not be applicable henceforth because of Flexi timings.

## **Student Counselling System**

### **Preamble:**

Students arriving at University for the first time or embarking on a programme may have to learn to adapt to significant changes, such as moving to a new area, separation from family and friends, establishing a new social network, managing a tight budget, combining academic study with family commitments and also adjusting to different cultures. These changes are exciting, challenging and an intrinsic part of the attraction of going to University. All these warrant facilitation of students towards a new turn in their journey of life.

CHARUSAT, through Student Counselling System, aims to foster academic excellence, positive mental attitude and general well-being of the students.

The Student Counselling System is a proactive and potential building activity that identifies the true potential of the students and brings it out, so as to facilitate students to achieve their academic and personal goals. The system shall be comprising of Counsellors, primarily the teachers, and the students themselves.

### **Approach to Counselling:**

The students shall be counselled in the areas of:

1. **Academic Matters** - By way of helping students set their career goals and guiding them as to how to achieve the goals.
2. **Social Matters** – By way of helping them understand various social inter-relationships like family, relatives, friends, peers, strangers and unforeseen events.
3. **Personal Matters affecting his/her career/ life** – By way of helping them understand their strengths and constraints and providing proper guidance to overcome the challenges.

### **General Guidelines:**

A broad-based ‘Student Counselling System’ is being envisaged which shall be, interactive and result-oriented, involving students, teachers and parents, addressing common student concerns ranging from anxiety, stress, fear of change and failure, homesickness and a slew of academic worries.



In view to meet the above:

1. All the Principals/ HoDs (Engg.) shall have to allocate counsellor teachers to the students at the beginning of the new Term. This has to be widely notified to the students and parents through display on the notice boards, emails, etc. within a week of the beginning of the Term.
2. Each teacher will act as a Counsellor with a batch ranging from 15 to 25 students allotted to him/her.
3. Students allocated to a particular counsellor will remain under his/her guidance till the completion of their studies (UG/PG Programmes). In the event of Teacher Counsellor leaving the University, other Teacher Counsellor may be allocated to the students by Principal immediately.
4. The Teacher Counsellor is expected to undertake and execute:
  - a. Ensuring enrollment formalities of their counselees and getting filled in all the details in e-governance of the University.
  - b. Maintaining and monitoring Attendance of their counselees and keeping their parents updated regularly at a maximum interval of one Month.
  - c. Keeping track of payment status of Fees (Term Fes/ Examination Fee, etc.) and updating parents of respective Counselees about the same, at regular intervals.
  - d. Analyzing Results and maintaining a growth chart of their counselees and keeping parents updated about the same. These shall include results of all types of assessments like Internal Examination, External Examination, Practical, Assignments, Projects, Industrial Training, etc.
  - e. Helping Counselees to identify and address the academic challenges faced.
  - f. Career Guidance to the Counselees.
  - g. Addressing Personal problems and social matters of the Counselees.
  - h. Facilitating Event participations and Professional Development of the Counselees.
  - i. Facilitating application for Convocation for Final Degree.
  - j. Helping counselees use the ERP system to the fullest.
  - k. Helping maintenance of alumni data, etc.
5. The Teacher Counsellor will need to have a thorough understanding of the credit system/ evaluation system for counselling a student for academic as well as other matters like:
  - a. Rules pertaining to Attendance

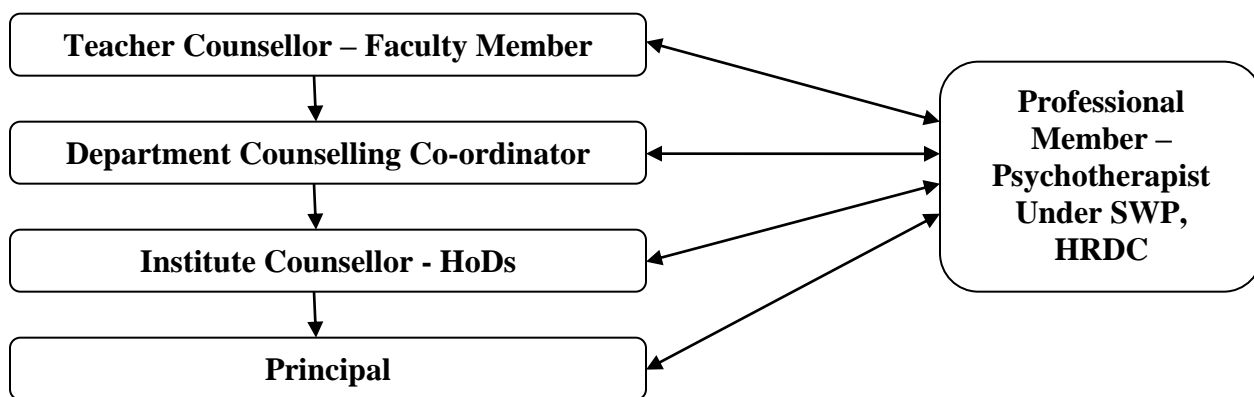
- b. Leave Application Process
  - c. Submissions of assignments/ projects, etc.
6. The Counselling should be undertaken in a planned manner to ensure continuity and consistency.
7. The counsellors shall keep the parents of their counsellees informed regularly at a maximum interval of one month.
8. The counsellors shall report the progress of their counsellees to the Department Counselling Coordinator every month.
9. The counselling activities shall be part of Performance Appraisals of the teachers.
10. The Principals shall have to regularly monitor the activities of Student Counselling and report to Academic Counsel in its meetings.

**Note:**

- An Online Test will be initiated and coordinated by HRDC for the Faculty Members to evaluate and ensure their thorough understanding of Credit Systems/ Evaluation System and other related academic matters, for the purpose of effective counselling.
- To equip the Teacher Counsellor with techniques of counselling, the teacher counsellor shall be provided advanced training under Senior Professional Counsellor.

**Counselling Structure:**

The Counselling Cell shall comprise of the following members:



**\*Note:** For Institutes other than CSPIT, “Principal” shall be the “Institute Counsellor”

- **Teacher Counsellor** – Faculty members
  - One Teacher Counsellor will be allocated to 15 to 25 students for counselling.  
(Please refer General Guidelines for details)

- Teacher Counsellor will report to Department Counselling Coordinator twice in every semester through Mentor Report. (Format as per **Annexure ‘D’**.)
- For students requiring immediate attention and remedial action, Teacher Counsellor shall immediately refer the said students directly to Institute Counsellor {Principal/HoD (Engg.)}.
- **Department Counselling Co-ordinator** – A Senior Faculty, having more than 05 years of teaching experience will be the Department Counselling Co-ordinator.
  - Department Counselling Co-ordinator will look after the counselling at departmental level and coordinate with the Teacher Counsellors for continuous feedback on the progress of the students twice in a semester.
  - Department Counselling Co-ordinator, having proven track record of effective teaching and counselling, shall also undertake the responsibility of meeting once in a month and guiding the “**Potential Learners**” and “**Progressive Learners**”, as referred by different Teacher Counsellors.
  - Considering the number of students referred by the Teacher Counsellors, additional Department Counselling Co-ordinators may be assigned by the Institute Counsellor.
  - The Department Counselling Coordinator shall report the progress made by the counselled students to Institute Counsellor {Principal/HoD(Engg.)} for necessary actions, wherever needed, once in every quarter.
- **Institute Counsellor** - The Head of the Department will be the Institute Counsellor. For Institutes other than CSPIT, “**Principal**” shall be the “**Institute Counsellor**”.
  - The Institute Counsellor will oversee the progress and the noticeable issues and shall take immediate remedial actions. (Please refer ‘Counselling System: Functional Flow’ for further guidance)
- **Professional Member** – A Professional Psychologist and Psycho Therapist, appointed under Student Wellness Programme, or Senior Psychologist, depending on gravity of the circumstance, will be the Professional Member.

### **Counselling System: Functional Flow**

1. As soon as a student gets enrolled and begins his/her sessions, he/she will be assigned to a particular Teacher Counsellor by the Principal/ HoD (Engg.). (Please refer **Annexure ‘A’**)

2. It will be a Teacher Counsellor's utmost responsibility to ensure that the new incumbent is comfortable in the new environment and is getting acclimatized. The illustrative model could be through building a rapport with the students by way of different activities, games and informal interactions carried out to help build strong Teacher-Taught relationship.
3. The Counsellor should ensure that all the Counselees under him/her have filled in all their personal details on e-governance of the University within two weeks of beginning of the Term.
4. The counsellors shall have a continuous observation of the academic performance, relation with the peers, behavior patterns and psychological conditions of their counselees, so as to be able to track any irregularity at an earlier stage and suggest corrective actions.
5. There upon, the counsellors shall conduct meeting, once in a fortnight, with their counselees, so as to be able to keep a track of their progress in academic, social and personal fronts. (Refer **Annexure 'B' & 'C'**) These meets need to be recorded with signature of the Counsellor as well as the Counselee. (Refer **Annexure 'D'**)
6. With 03-Tier System of Student Wellness Programme (SWP) in place, the Teacher Counsellor shall also take into consideration that:
  - All their Counselees have gone through the 03 Tier System in place under Student Wellness Programme(SWP).
  - Every Tuesday, SWP Counsellor, will meet Students of particular Institute/ Department with prior permission from Principal/Deans/HODs for Group Interaction Session to assess the overall wellness level of the students by way of direct interaction and filling up questionnaire to assess the pattern of further counselling support required.
  - On critical appraisal of the questionnaire, the SWP Counsellor shall group the students under 3 different Tier of Interactions. {Kindly refer the Functional Flow of SWP, for further details, as attached}
  - The Teacher Counsellor shall, on receipt of list of students in Tier 01 and Tier 02, take necessary actions for the issues highlighted and ensure the student's progress.
  - Teacher Counsellors need to furnish to the Department Counselling Coordinator and HRDC, a Mentor's Report (MR) twice in a semester, highlighting students' state of being for closer observation and report to SWP on the progress made. (Kindly Refer **Annuxure 'E'**)

- A Quarterly Comprehensive Report has to be prepared by SWP Counsellor, putting together the progress reports of all ‘Three Tiers’, and to be submitted to HRDC which in turn will be forwarded to the respective Institute Counsellor {Principal/HoD(Engg.)}.
7. After completion of a Semester and announcement of results of the students, the Teacher Counsellor will segregate their respective counselees on the basis of academic Performance as under:
    - **Potential Learners** : CGPA < 5
    - **Progressive Learners** : CGPA 5 to 7
    - **Proficient Learners** : CGPA above 7
  8. Herein, the Teacher Counsellor should arrange for frequent sessions with the ‘**Potential Learners**’ and ‘**Progressive Learners**’ and guide them to focus on clearing the backlogs first, if any, and subsequently endeavour towards improving CGPA/SGPA.
  9. Further, the Teacher Counsellor shall refer the ‘**Potential Learners**’ and ‘**Progressive Learners**’ to Department Counselling Co-ordinators, once in a month as outlined under Counselling Structure – Department Counselling Co-ordinator.
  10. In order to achieve students’ optimal development and well-being, a Parent-Teacher’s meet, with parents of ‘**Potential Learners**’ as well as ‘**Progressive Learners**’, shall be organized after a month of announcement of results, so as to enable the Teacher Counsellors and the Department Counselling Co-ordinators to convey the progress made by the students to their parents.
  11. The ‘**Proficient Learners**’ having academic excellence should be encouraged and guided by the Institute Counsellors for greater participation in Inter-University events and activities, State/ National level competitions/Workshop/Seminars, etc.. Such exposure will ultimately contribute towards holistic growth of the student.

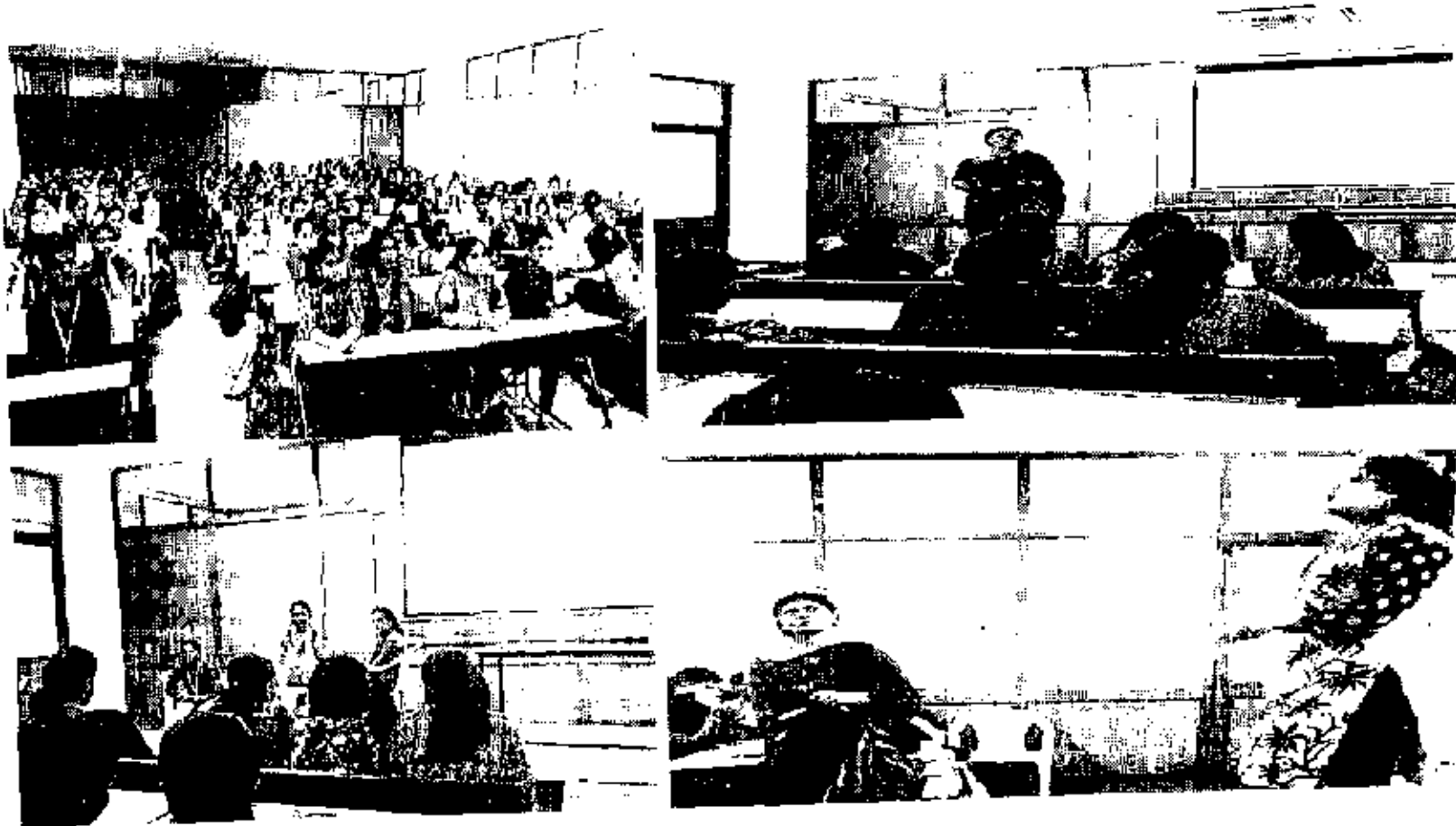

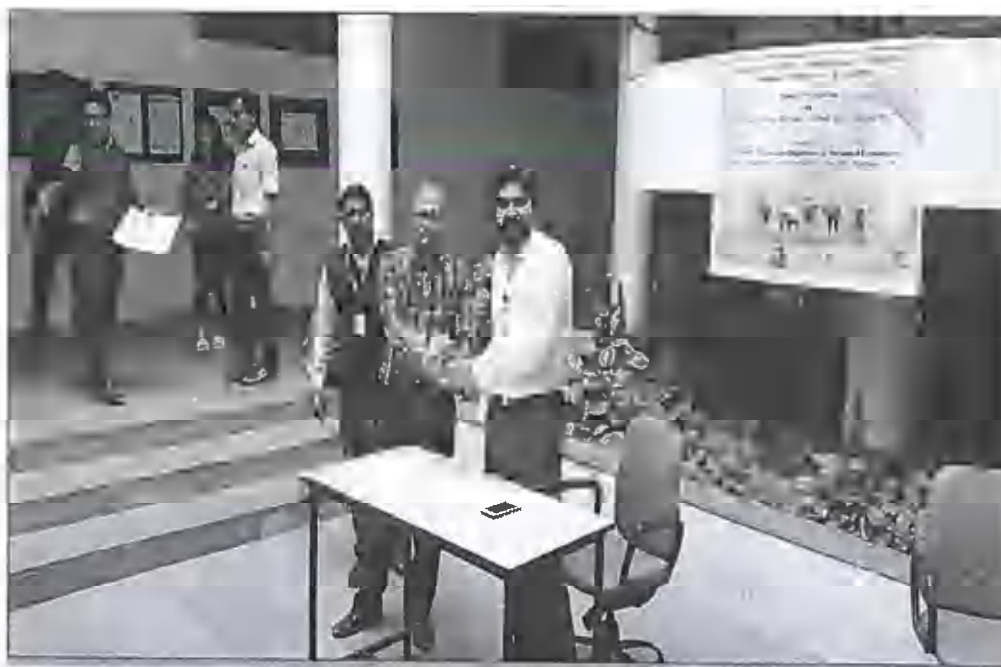

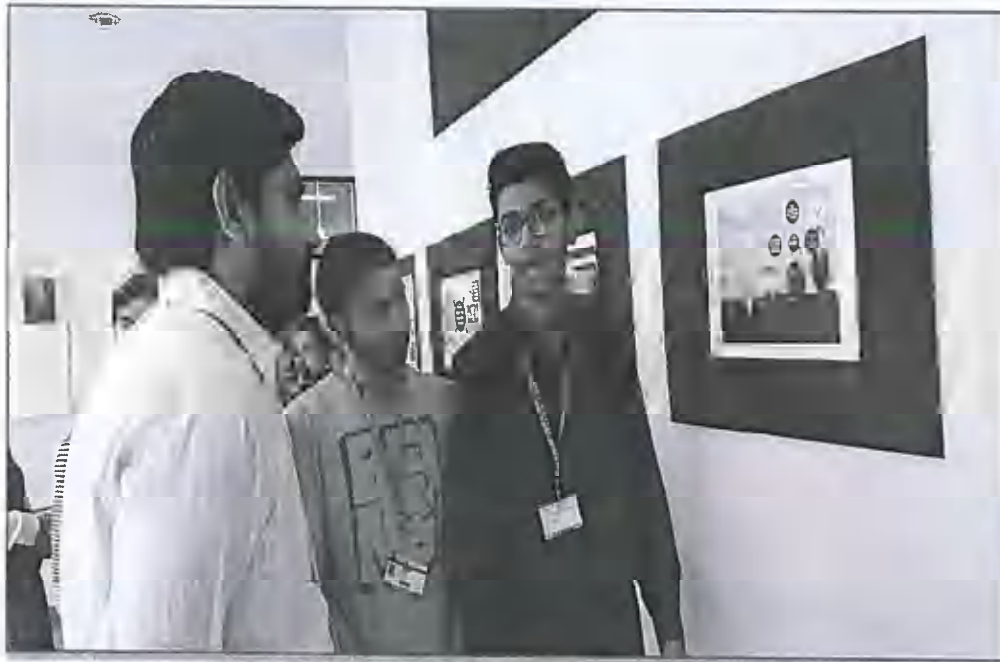

## **V. In detail explanation of the event with colored print of photographs**

Coronaviruses (CoV) are a large family of viruses that cause illness ranging from the common cold to more severe diseases such as Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS-CoV) and Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS-CoV). A novel coronavirus (nCoV) is a new strain that has not been previously identified in humans. Coronaviruses are zoonotic, meaning they are transmitted between animals and people. Detailed investigations found that SARS-CoV was transmitted from civet cats to humans and MERS-CoV from dromedary camels to humans. Several known coronaviruses are circulating in animals that have not yet infected humans. Common signs of infection include respiratory symptoms, fever, cough, shortness of breath and breathing difficulties. In more severe cases, infection can cause pneumonia, severe acute respiratory syndrome, kidney failure and even death. Standard recommendations to prevent infection spread include regular hand washing, covering mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing, thoroughly cooking meat and eggs. Avoid close contact with anyone showing symptoms of respiratory illness such as coughing and sneezing.

Students made more than 25 charts and models including title, logo of corona virus, what it is, prevalence rate, cause, chain, symptoms, vital statistics, preventive aspects etc. Students explained that WHO is working closely with global experts, governments and partners to rapidly expand scientific knowledge on this new virus, to track the spread and virulence of the virus, and to provide advice to countries and individuals on measures to protect health and prevent the spread of this outbreak. It was concerned about a rise in cases with no clear link to China - where the virus was first detected in the city of Wuhan in Hubei province in late December - and called for urgent funding to support countries with weaker health systems.

It is also known as covid 19, For confirmed coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) cases, reported illnesses have ranged from mild symptoms to severe illness and death. Symptoms can include: Fever, Cough, Shortness of breath, CDC believes at this time that symptoms of COVID-19 may appear in as few as 2 days or as long as 14 days after exposure. This is based on what has been seen previously as the incubation period of MERS-CoV viruses. The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person. Between people who are in close contact with one another (within

about 6 feet) Via respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs. It may be possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads. People are thought to be most contagious when they are most symptomatic (the sickest). Some spread might be possible before people show symptoms; there have been reports of this with this new coronavirus, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

Students added in their explanation that very easily a virus spreads from person-to-person can vary. Some viruses are highly contagious (like measles), while other viruses are less so. Another factor is whether the spread continues over multiple generations of people (if spread is sustained). The virus that causes COVID-19 seems to be spreading easily and sustainably in Hubei province and other parts of China. In the United States, spread from person-to-person has occurred only among a few close contacts and has not spread any further to date. CDC has developed a new laboratory test kit for use in testing patient specimens for severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2), the virus that causes COVID-19. The test kit is called the “Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) 2019-Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) Real-Time Reverse Transcriptase (RT)-PCR Diagnostic Panel.” It is intended for use with the Applied Biosystems 7500 Fast DX Real-Time PCR Instrument with SDS 1.4 software. This test is intended for use with upper and lower respiratory specimens collected from persons who meet CDC criteria for COVID-19 testing. CDC’s test kit is intended for use by laboratories designated by CDC as qualified, and in the United States, certified under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) to perform high complexity tests. The test kits also will be shipped to qualified international laboratories, such as World Health Organization (WHO) Global Influenza Surveillance Response System (GISRS) laboratories.

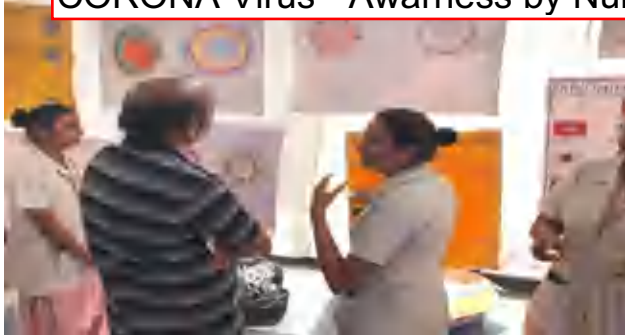
There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus. However, as a reminder, CDC always recommends everyday preventive actions to help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases, including: Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.

Stay home when you are sick. Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe. Follow CDC's recommendations for using a facemask. CDC does not recommend that people who are well wear a facemask to protect themselves from respiratory diseases, including COVID-19. Facemasks should be used by people who show symptoms of COVID-19 to help prevent the spread of the disease to others. The use of facemasks is also crucial for health workers and people who are taking care of someone in close settings (at home or in a health care facility). Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.

Students performed very interesting dance in an innovative way to demonstrate hand washing techniques. This dance really motivated the school students to adopt good habit of washing their hands. Students were played the role of dattol antiseptic solutions, water and hand which was the most attractive theme and eye catching scene in this dance activity



CORONA Virus - Awareness by Nursing Students 17.02.2020



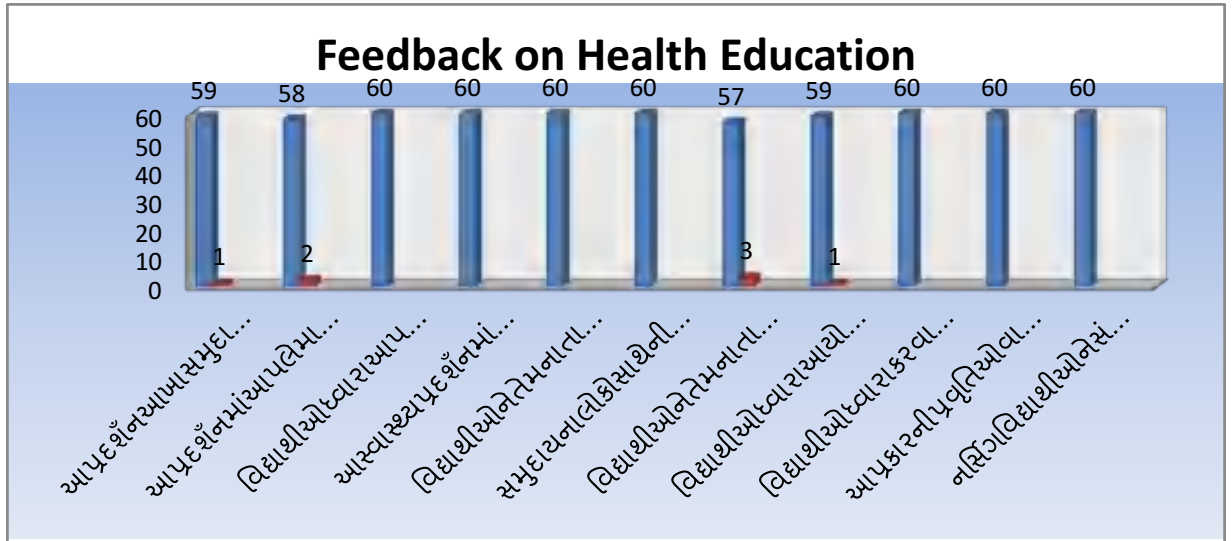

### **1. Preface:**

The student counselling system is a proactive and potential building activity that identifies the true potential of the students and brings it out, so as to facilitate students to achieve their academic and personal goals.

The system comprises of counselors – primarily teachers, the students and the therapeutic support and interventions by SWP Counselor, a clinical psychologist.

### **Objectives:**

CHARUSAT, through student counselling system aims to foster:

- Academic excellence.
- Positive Mental Attitude.
- General Well-being of the students.

### **2. The areas looked into:**

The students are being counseled in the areas of:

1. Academic Matters: By way of helping students set their career goals and guiding them as to how to achieve the goals.
2. Social Matters: By way of helping them undertake various social inter-relationships like family, relatives, friends, peers, strangers and unforeseen events.
3. Personal Matters affecting his/her career life: By way of helping them understand their strengths and constraints and provide proper guidance to overcome the challenges.

### **3. The Functional Flow Designs of SWP 3-Tier System:**

- SWP Counsellor conducts “*Group Interaction Sessions*” to assess the overall wellness level of the students. SWP Counsellor gets the “*Student Wellness Questionnaire*” filled up by the students to ascertain the patterns of further counselling support required.
- The Questionnaire is based on psychometric principles to measure key aspects of human personality namely:
  - Positive Personal Traits
  - Dark Personal Traits
  - Motivation, Values, Preferences
  - Cognitive Ability
  - Emotional Stability
  - Interpersonal capabilities
  - Addiction
  - Confidence
  - Concentration
  - Study Habits

On critical appraisal of the student wellness questionnaire students are grouped under 3-  
***Tier Systems of Intervention:***

#### **Tier-I:**

Students falling under this group are potential learners with mild to moderate level of immaturity. Hence, there arises the need for regular guidance driven Intervention by their respective Teacher Mentors.

#### **Tier-II:**

Students falling under this group are capable lot, but lacking motivation, indifferent, inattentive and passive in their approach to studies. Hence, there arises the need for Individual Intervention for motivation and support.

#### **Tier-III:**

Students falling under this group are “*Students at Risk*”. Hence, there arises the need for One-to-One Therapeutic Intervention by SWP Counselor.

## 5. Highlights of Analysis

Under 3-Tier System of SWP, students falling into the category of Tier III are profiled as “*Students at Risk*”. Hence, One to One Intervention Sessions are carried out by SWP Counsellor with the respective students.

The analysis of Groups Session with students have clearly indicated that there exists an upward swing towards One to One Session.

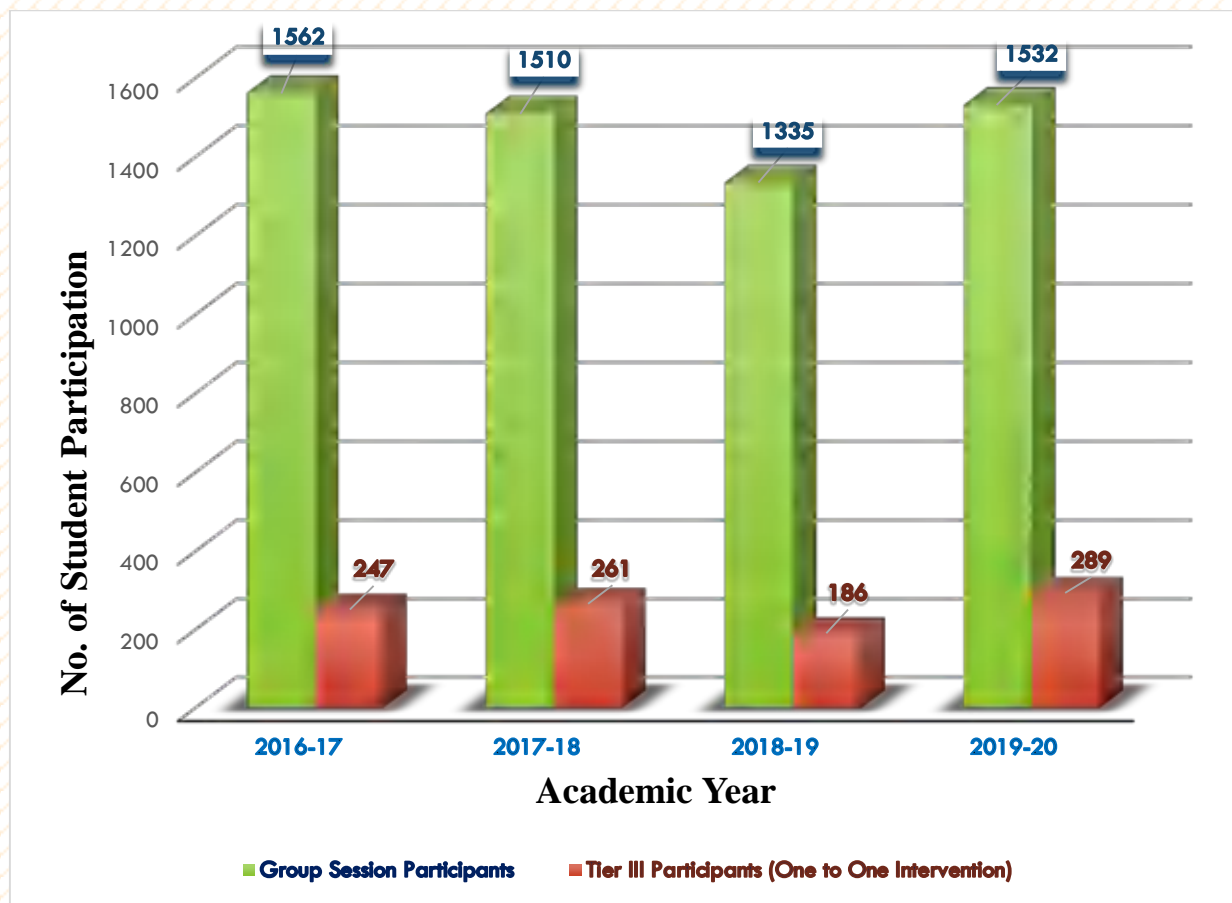
The analysis has also brought out the percentage of good number of students seeking help for personal interaction besides Tier III Interventions.

The Students categorized under Tier I and Tier II are the remaining students of the group session. Students under Tier II getting regular guidance from their respective Teacher Mentors and Students under Tier I are potential learners.

## 6. Findings of the SWP Counselor

The findings of the SWP counselor with regards to the students intervened highlighted the following concerned areas:

### **Tier I:**

- Lack of Concentration
- Difficulty in learning
- Difficulty in execution
- Procrastination Habit
- Understanding Problem-Subject centric viz Math's/Engineering Drawing

### **Tier II:**

- Lack of Clear Goal
- Lack of Self Confidence
- Difficulty in Decision Making
- Reluctant towards Hard work
- Mental Confusion

### **Tier III:**

- Presence of Inferiority complex
- Infatuation issue
- Anxiety and Panic
- Lack of Emotional Control
- Anger Issues
- Sensitive towards Criticism
- Increased Peer Group Pressure – Hostel/College Campus
- Lack of Self Discipline
- Low tolerance level
- Weak Competency Level in English Language impacting both Self-Esteem and Academic Performance

### **7. Suggested Improvement Measures:**

In order to improve upon Psycho-Social Well-Being of the Students, Training through Brief Workshop Sessions need to be organized in the areas as under:

1. Goal Setting
2. Art of Managing Time
3. Learning Strategies
4. Self-Management skills
5. Enhancing Self- Esteem
6. Proficiency in English Language

### **8. Parental Guidance:**

During the period under review, SWP Counselor has counseled Guardians/Parents of students in as under:

#### ***Case: 1 Parental Guidance for Student's Lack of Interest in Engineering Course:***

- The Parent of the respective ward has been advised to give due importance to his/her ward's area of interest in order to gradually make him or her aware of the importance of career growth in the chosen field.

- The counselor suggested that aptitude testing and comprehensive career counseling sessions may be taken up for speedy improvement.
- The student is undergoing comprehensive career counseling from referral professional.

***Case: 2 Parental Guidance for Student having Slow learning tendency:***

- SWP Counselor elaborately discussed on the factors related to slow learning tendency of his/her ward and advised for tutorial classes and frequent interaction with concerned teachers.
- The student counselor has informed that the concerned student is coping up well with studies.

***Case: 3 Parental Guidance for Student's Psychotic Issue:***

- SWP Counselor has briefed the guardian about his/her ward's problems and issues. He also advised them for taking Psychiatric assistance for improving the current state of being.
- The teacher counselor intimated that the guardian has opted for drop of the student from the current term for wellbeing of mental and physical health.

***Case: 4 Parental Guidance for Student's Depressive Syndrome***

- Parents of the ward have had consecutive sessions with SWP Counselor.
- The counselor made the parents clearly aware of the depressive syndrome noticed in student during his one to one intervention session. He advised regular counseling and medication for the student.
- The student has made remarkable improvement as confirmed by Principle of the respective institute.



## 9. Encouraging ‘SWP Case Studies’

During the period under review, SWP Counselor has had interacted with students having issues relating to Adolescent Crisis, Mixed Anxiety & Depression, Panic, Adolescent Depression, Career Confusion, and Low Self Esteem.

SWP Counselor has showcased **seven such cases** showing impact of therapeutic interventions and significant improvement in the post counselling sessions.

### **SWP Case Studies: Impact of therapeutic interventions**

#### **Study: 1**

Niley was refereed by his mentor for his poor performance in his academics. The Case history reveals that he never had liking for his science or engineering subjects, but has been forcefully put into the stream because of his parents and uncle wishes.

His teacher says that Niley has the potential to do so much more in class because when giving oral responses, he understands the daily lessons, but fails with the written work and shows lack of involvement and concentration in the classroom situation.

He seems to be suffering from moderate level of Adolescent Crisis & moderate level of Depression. Due to this, he has shown additional symptoms like inattention, irritability, impulsivity, anxiety, nervousness, frustrated and depressive at times during the same period.

Improvement of Academic Performance: Our therapeutic goal regarding Niley’s academic performance was to help him feel more motivated and capable because I had a suspicion he was not receiving correct guidance and motivation/ emotional support at home.

Our approach was to determine some of his other abilities and to provide continuing affirmations of those abilities. I conducted many one to one motivational counseling sessions based on his availability.



To attempt to address the problems, the SWP counselor took following measures.

- A. Conducted parents meeting to know other details and to inform the parent regarding his mental status.
- B. Motivate him to attain his classes on a regular basis.
- C. Taught him self-hypnosis to master his moods & emotions
- D. Motivated him to write his own stories n quotes regularly;
- E. Clarified his life goals and thought process.
- F. Made him complete his class assignments & study regularly for his graduation.

In conclusion, he has come out of adolescent crisis and resolved his Identity Crisis greatly by now. He has almost completed his graduation and now planning to start his career in the education field. Along the way he has developed his Thinking, Social skills and Communication skills.

### **Study: 2**

The example of a 20-year-old college girl who was brought in by her fellow classmate. Initially she was very shy, introvert, with lack of assertiveness but responded well to psychological therapy, including assertiveness and cognitive training.

Before the therapy, she was suffering from mild anxiety and depression for more than six months due to recent breakup with her boyfriend and unhealthy relationship with her father. During the same period, she showed symptoms like sad mood, marked anxiety, & tension, insomnia, lethargic, loss of confidence & esteem etc.

She was always in dispute with her other family members, who she claimed gave her poor career advice and neglected her individual ideas at times. She had frequent episodes of a depressed, angry mood in which she felt fully justified in wallowing in her anger.

One feature of her resentment is that 'it eats away' and she 'cannot let it go'. However, her anger problem seems to resurface anytime & was almost entirely dependent on her mood, for which few triggers can be found within her immediate environment.

A negative mood triggers past resentments, and her mood spirals down into anger. However, events that actually justify resentment can be dismissed when she is in a good mood, and if distracted by a work obligation or a friendly social interaction, her mood can change rapidly for the better. This was demonstrated within a few counseling sessions that began in a depressed and ruminative way but was quickly turned around by Cognitive Behavior Approach.

Cognitive approach in use has to be consistent with her own preferred way of approaching the problem. In the course of her therapy, she became persuaded by the idea that she was perpetuating her negative moods and accompanying resentments by the way she coped with them. In particular, her rapid shifts of mood that seemed to depend on changes in her own thinking (or were influenced by social interactions that changed her thinking) convinced her of this. The instruction to accept her negative thoughts and moods and not to fight them or do anything (apart from passing the time in a pleasant way) led to a rapid change in the way she saw her 'problem'. She reinforced this new strategy by attending regular counseling sessions at HRDC.

She now has a number of close friends and lives happily with her parents.

*[Nature of the Disorder treated: Mixed Anxiety & Depression]*

### **Study: 3**

Anil is a young boy and has just completed his Higher Secondary from a high school in Baroda. He is very shy and remains nervous and anxious most of the time. He has rarely dated any girl in his school life but secretly loved & wanted to married his dream girl in some other city.

However, Anil was afraid to propose her and was suffering from fear of rejection severely. Most days he would read various romantic novels at home or talk to his close friends regarding his plan of dropping out of college and spend his available time to write a great romantic novel.

By the time Anil came to therapy, he had already lost interest in his studies and wanted to leave the college before the commencement of next semester. Therapy began by exploring why he was not interested in his studies. It was discovered that he secretly loved an older girl from his school days and wanted to impress or enchant her with his great romantic novel. This idea consumed his mind over a six months period. He had never disclosed about his career plan to his parents. Later he started suffering from guilt, unhappy moods & developed a very pessimistic attitude towards life but also wanted to get rid his low mental status.

His feelings of ambivalence had developed into moderate level of depression which made him to isolate and avoid college and friends.

During therapy Anil was able to work through his thoughts & emotions. His depression lessened gradually. Later therapy was focused on helping him to develop appropriate coping up skills. Eventually he began taking interest in his studies and has developed regularity and punctuality.

*[Nature of the Disorder treated: Adolescent Depression]*

#### **Study: 4**

Richa is a third year student of our university. Things started out good in the beginning of the year but gradually deteriorated after her 5th semester exams. Due to some stupid negligence or mistake of hers, she was given UMN in examination. Later Examination Committee met and found her guilty and told her to reappear for all the five course work or subject papers.

Usually Richa would occupy herself with college work, other extracurricular duties and helping her classmates and other roommates with various assignments throughout the year. After this mishap, most of the students developed aversion towards her and started avoiding her. Gradually she felt misunderstood, helpless & felt trapped in the unwanted situation.

Feelings of frustration and anger would occasionally rise to the surface, but most of the time she just kept it all inside which finally turned into depression and started avoiding her college & Studies.

When Richa started counseling, she first discovered her deep underline feeling of unfairness which had led to her sadness and unhappiness. She felt that she was misunderstood, hurt, ridiculed by her teachers & friends and didn't know whether she wanted to stay in the course or leave. She was more concerned about her reputation.

The therapy focused on her emotional pattern of behavior indicating depression. Later she discovered that her thinking was in clouded in many ways like her friends. She tried to control her emotional reactivity and used her critical thinking skills to come to an appropriate and rational decision.

Gradually Richa developed a healthy mental state from her counseling and as she began to get ready for her upcoming challenge or exams. Luckily her case was reassessed and she was allowed to reappear for only one term paper.

*[Nature of the Disorder treated: Moderate Adolescent Depression]*

### **Study: 5**

Jaya was a last year student of management studies and ready for a next challenge in her life. She was from a very conservative business family and had confusion regarding her further studies.

She was confused between taking a job and getting some organizational experience or continues with her master degree program in some other reputed college.

She wanted to get into the Banking services because it is exciting and new developments were happening all the time. But she was upset by the lack of loyalty that large companies showed to their employees.



When Jaya came to career counseling, the first question she asked was “What else I can do in my life?” She took a battery of assessments and found that she had natural abilities in the Marketing and Communication areas. The more she explored, the more interested she became in improving her interpersonal skills. She was advised to enroll in a course designed to improve English & Communication skills in her vacations.

During this course she met another student and together they developed a business plan. Jaya had found a new challenge and was ready to move forward.

*[Nature of the problem treated: Career Confusion]*

### **Study: 6**

This is the story of one of our student. Let's name her 'Khushi'. This is her tale of 'Anxiety and Panic'. Teacher counselor referred Khushi and her Mother to the SWP Counselor.

The counselor, could clearly read on her face the symptoms of hyper anxiety and panic. Mother narrated that Khushi passed out Board Examination with above average standing and had taken keen interest in the discipline of Engineering. She got admitted in the discipline of engineering.

The sign of anxiety and panic started overtaking her while proceeding from residence to college by Institutes' Bus. She used to feel unhappy and a sense of panicky used to take over her as soon the bus approaches the college campus. She could reach the classroom and used to sit in a corner alone.

The sense of anxiety gradually takes her to the stage of crying and getting out of the classroom frequently. The teacher counselor inquired from her mother as to the prevalence of such symptoms earlier. Mother clarified, saying that such nervousness she could noticed in her only when preparing for proceeding to college. The matter became quite acute as she got out of the bus twice and decided not to go to college again. The matter was referred to SWP Counselor.

SWP Counselor diagnosed it as an issue of self-imposed sense of loneliness. In repeated counseling sessions attempts were made to develop a sense of self confidence in her. Mother even took the initiative to take her to SWP Counselor at Baroda for more intense individual intervention session. With regular intervention sessions and applying techniques of hypno-therapy, she was gradually relieved of the symptoms of anxiety and panic.

Clear sign of self-confidence was visible on her face. She started coming to college without any symptom of anxiety and panic. She not only became regular in the class attendance, but also became quite lively with other fellow students. This resulted in remarkable improvement in her academic performance scoring CGPA above 7. She could conquer emotional upheaval and to take on the journey of life courageously.

### **Study: 7**

This is the story of one of our student. Let's name him 'Adarsh '. This is his tale of 'Low Self-esteem and lack of interest in chosen course' in the discipline of Engineering.

Adarsh have had taken keen interest in Cricket since school days and dreamt to be a Cricket Player. Parents never liked his interest in cricket although he managed to pass out Board Examination with good scoring. The parents, however, assured him of his chosen field once he successfully comes out of school education. Besides his interest in cricket, he had keen interest in Writing Stories and Poems.

Parents came out with firm decision of getting him admitted in one of the disciplines of Engineering. Adarsh accepted his parent's decision but not admitting from within. This resulted in great depression. With this depressive mode he continued his first and second year of the college with a sense of hatred for the parent's decision and a sense of low esteem took him over. This impacted in lack of interest in studies and attendance. The mentor noticed the change in him and sought intervention of SWP Counselor.

SWP Counselor, on critical inquiry, found out that Adarsh has genuine love for Writing besides the game of Cricket. Taking a cue from Adarsh' self-expression, counselor through various stories and writings from renowned writers, empowered his faith in his area of interest. Adarsh was encouraged to write articles of his interest and showed it to SWP Counselor. With the help of consecutive one to one session with Adarsh in the form of story-telling and writing, a sense of confidence was built up in him.

This has resulted in a change of Adarsh's attitude towards his parents. He started having a sense of love and respect for the parents instead of hatred that reined over him earlier. He has also started taking good efforts in academics as well as in other events of the institution.

Now he proudly says, 'he can accomplish the dream of his life'.

*[Nature of the problem treated: Low Self-Esteem / Adolescent crises]*

## **10. Neo Initiatives of SWP:**

### **SWP REACH Programme:**

- HRDC introduced SWP Reach Programme wherein SWP Councillor's Service has been made available at the respective institute on every Tuesday and first Friday of the month.
- The objective of Reach Program is to reach out to maximum Students and their Mentors as well as to the Parents wherever need be, through compassionate therapeutic interventions, so as to promote renewed hopes, personal fulfillment and academic enrichment.

### **Student Happiness and Progression Survey:**

- In line with SWP Group Sessions, HRDC proposes to initiate a Survey: Phase 2 under the caption '*Student Happiness and Progression Survey*' in order to get a feel of the First Year Student's Academic and Emotional bonding with University.



- The objective is to be in constant touch with student's need and the improvement required there upon. This will also serve as secondary data for NAAC criteria under Student Satisfaction Survey.

**SWP Research Approach towards Psycho-Social Elements:**

- HRDC proposes under SWP Activity, to explore how formulating interventions on the basis of Psycho-Social factors offer an avenue for student's to address specific attitudes, emotions, and behaviors that relate to college success.

**Faculty Wellness Programme:**

- An initiative which HRDC, under SWP, Activity proposes to endeavour.

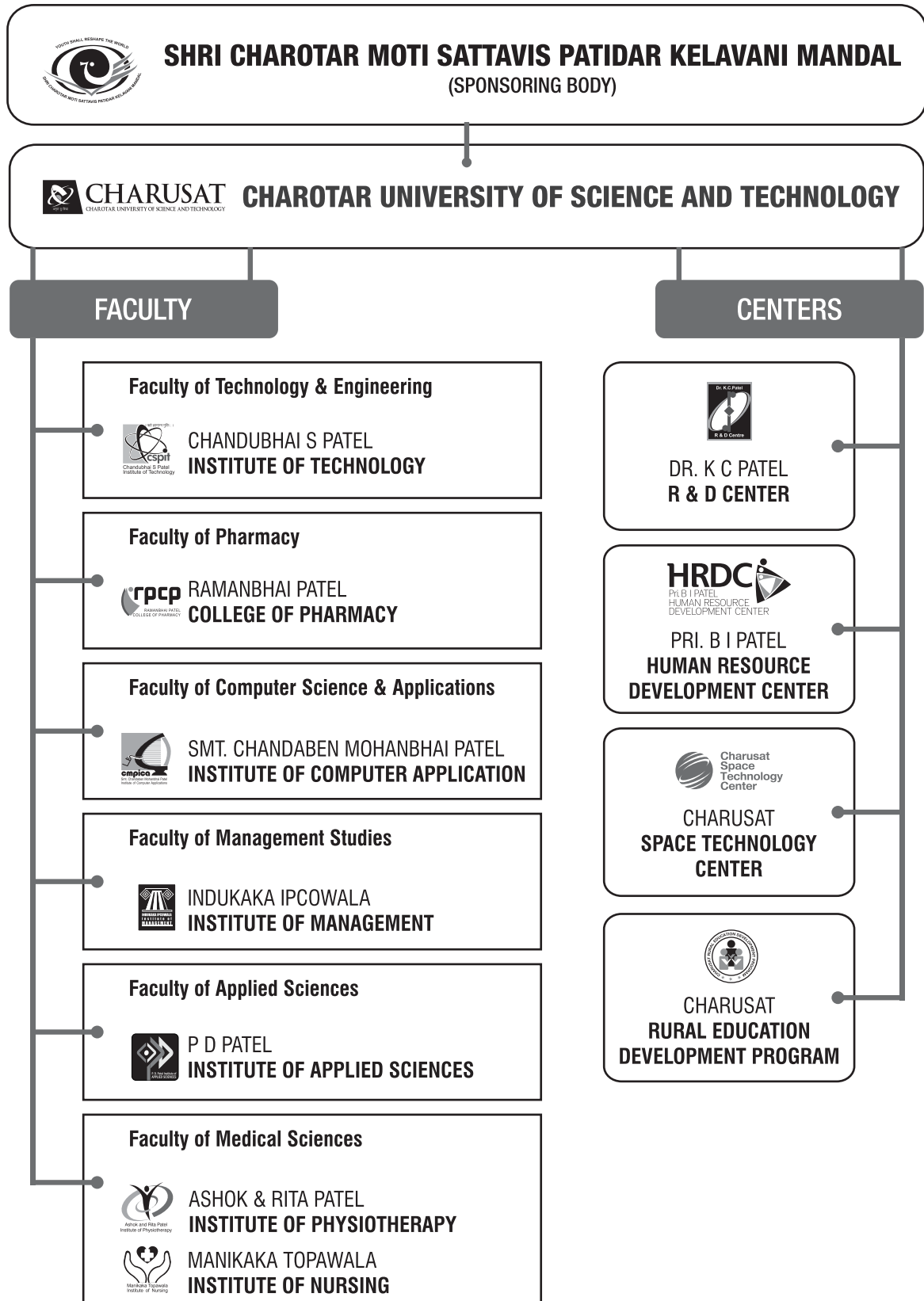

including turning in someone's work as one's own (another student's, a purchased paper from an online source, etc.)

## **Plagiarism is another form of cheating and academic dishonesty. Intentional or unintentional plagiarism is an offense. Plagiarism includes :**

use to any degree of the ideas or words of one's source material without proper acknowledgement. Plagiarism typically takes two forms:

failure to acknowledge the use of an author's ideas or organization by footnote or identification of the source in the text of the paper.

Incomplete paraphrase (mere rearrangement of syntax and substitution of synonyms for the author's words) is plagiarism.

failure to acknowledge the use of an author's words by quotation marks, as well as by footnote or identification in the text.

You may consult your teacher or counsellor to know more on how to avoid cheating, plagiarism and maintain academic integrity.

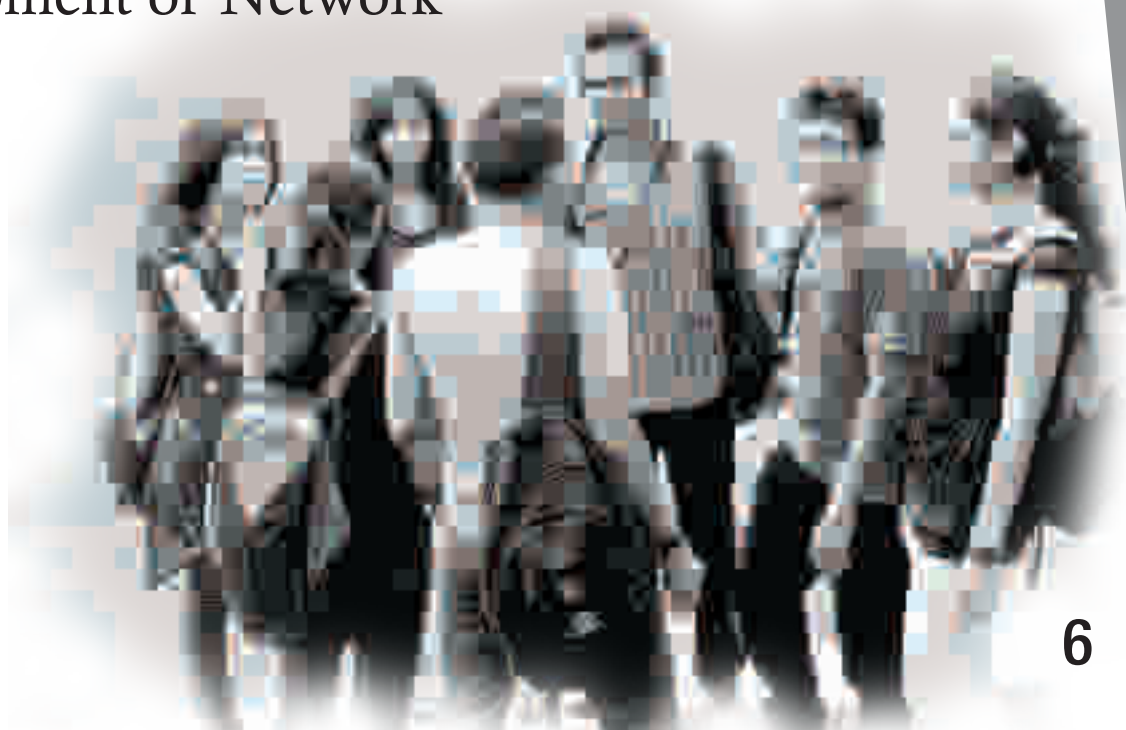
# Social Life

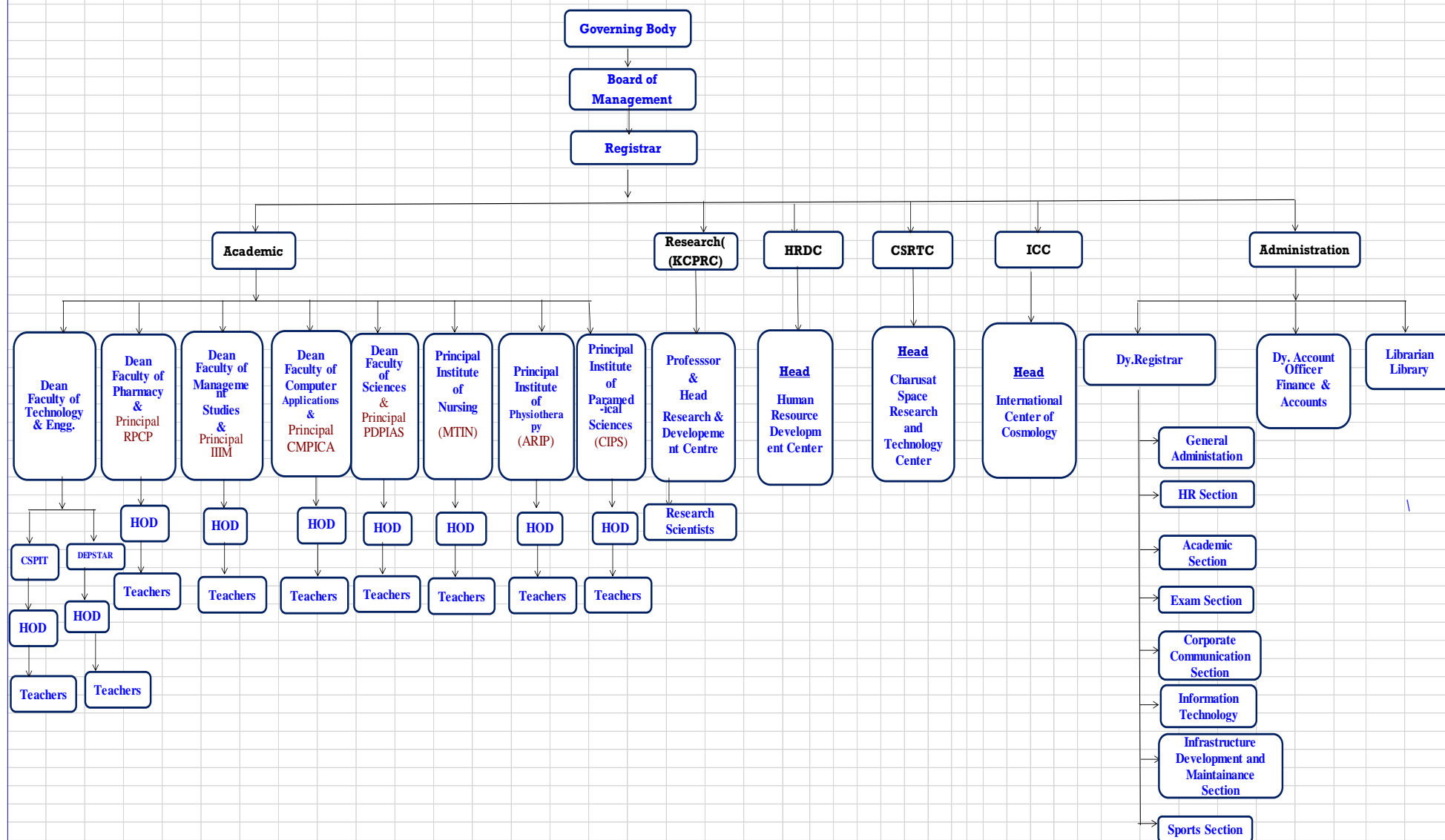

## ADMINISTRATION OF LEAVES

### Regarding Office Timing and Leave Administration

Charusat has introduced Flexi timing from 01.09.2020. This shall give sufficient flexibility to teachers to pursue their academic as well as research activities.

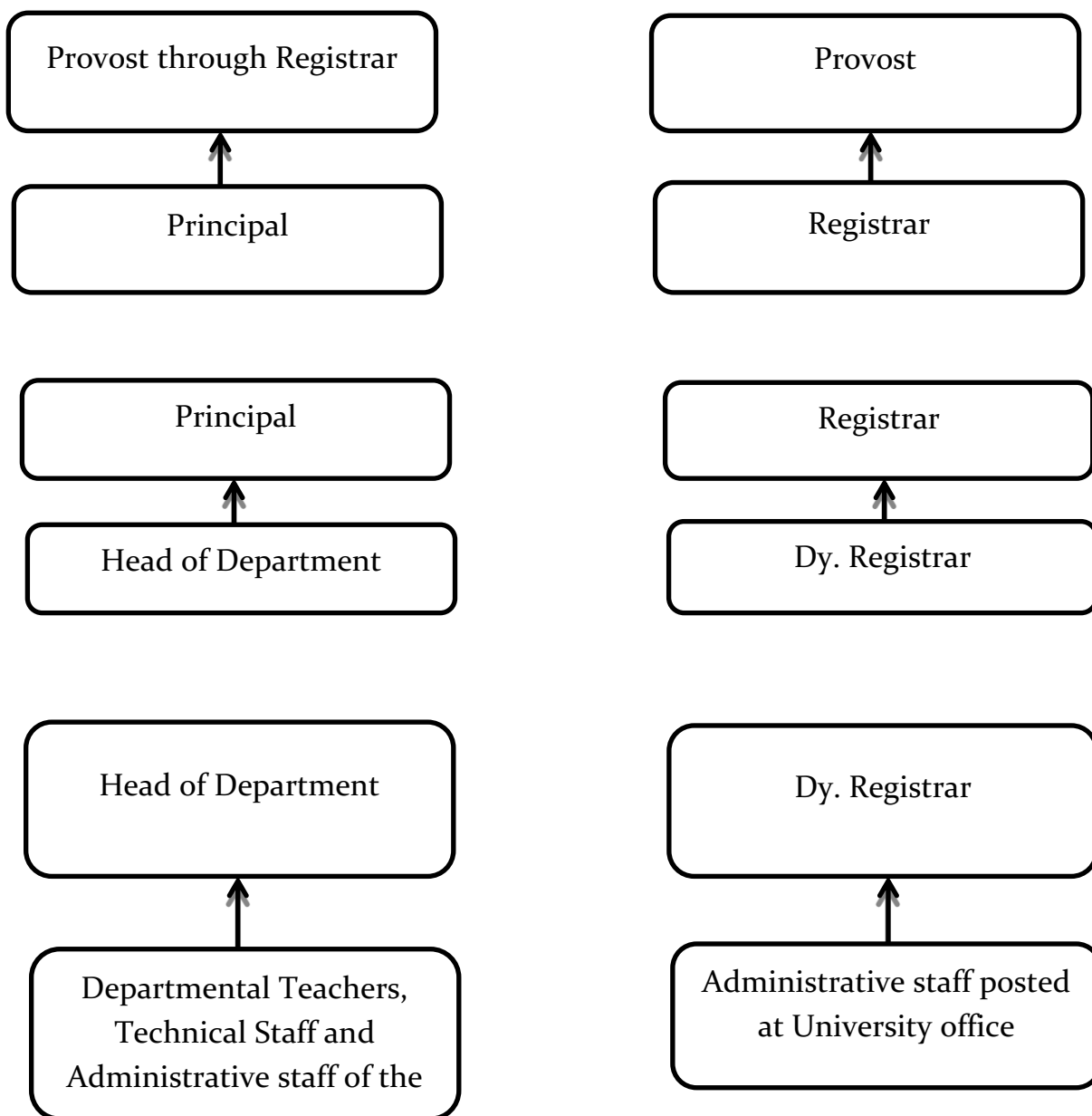
### The following points have to be considered while availing the Flexi timing facility to staff members (Teaching and Non Teaching Cadre) :

1. Work-hours per day shall be a minimum of 7.30 hours including a half-hour lunch break. Total work hours per week shall not be less than 42 hours.
2. All academic assignments like lectures/laboratories etc. as per institutional time-table shall have to be diligently adhered to. Any discrepancy in that shall be construed as misconduct.
3. Every working day from 11:00 am to 03:00 pm shall be core timing where all staff members shall be available.
4. It is necessary for all the employees to register the fingerprint impression every day for both the time to avoid any discrepancies. If the system finds a single time punch or No punch of any employee then the system will mark CL /LWP.
5. It is absolutely necessary to apply for leave in e-Governance within 3 days of the first day of leave. Failing which his/her leave will be considered as CL / LWP.
6. For the presence of half-day, the presence of four hours' time duration is required.
7. Provision of early going and late coming relaxation for two times in a month will not be applicable henceforth because of Flexi timings.
8. The fingerprint should be registered at the machines installed at their respective faculty building only.
9. It is very important to get leave sanctioned before proceeding on leave. However, in emergency an employee can be on leave with oral sanction of authority. Employee will have to make necessary arrangement of his/her work load with other colleagues. In such event it is absolutely necessary to fill the leave report on the day he/she rejoins the duty, failing which his/her leave will be considered as leave without pay.
10. Anybody proceeding on leave without prior sanction will be marked absent.
11. No employee shall leave his/her office without permission of concerned authority. No employee shall leave the campus during office hours for the reasons other than official duty as permitted by authority. If any employee leaves the campus during office hours, he/she should put figure print impression at both the time – leaving and coming back to the campus.
12. All the staff members should take lunch in the campus itself.
13. All the peons should come half an hour early and leave the campus half an hour later than that of schedule of the University, i.e. they should come before 8.30 a.m. and leave the office after 5.00 p.m. The Principal/HOD may stagger peon's duties as per their requirements.
14. It is necessary for all the peons to come in uniform every day without fail.
15. All are requested to follow these rules.

## LEAVE SANCTION COMMUNICATION PROCESS

1. Leaves (Casual leave /Sick Leave/ Duty leave/ Privilege Leave /Earn Leave) up to 4 days will be sanctioned by HOD/Principal; all other types of leave will be sanctioned by Registrar in consultation with Provost.
2. Where HOD are not there, sanctioning authority will be Principal.
3. Only the Employees with salary under Pay band below (9300-34800) shall be eligible for exchange leave.
4. Principals, for their leaves should get sanction from Provost through Registrar.
5. For leaves of special kind, exceptional cases etc.; Provost/BOM shall be the sanctioning authority.

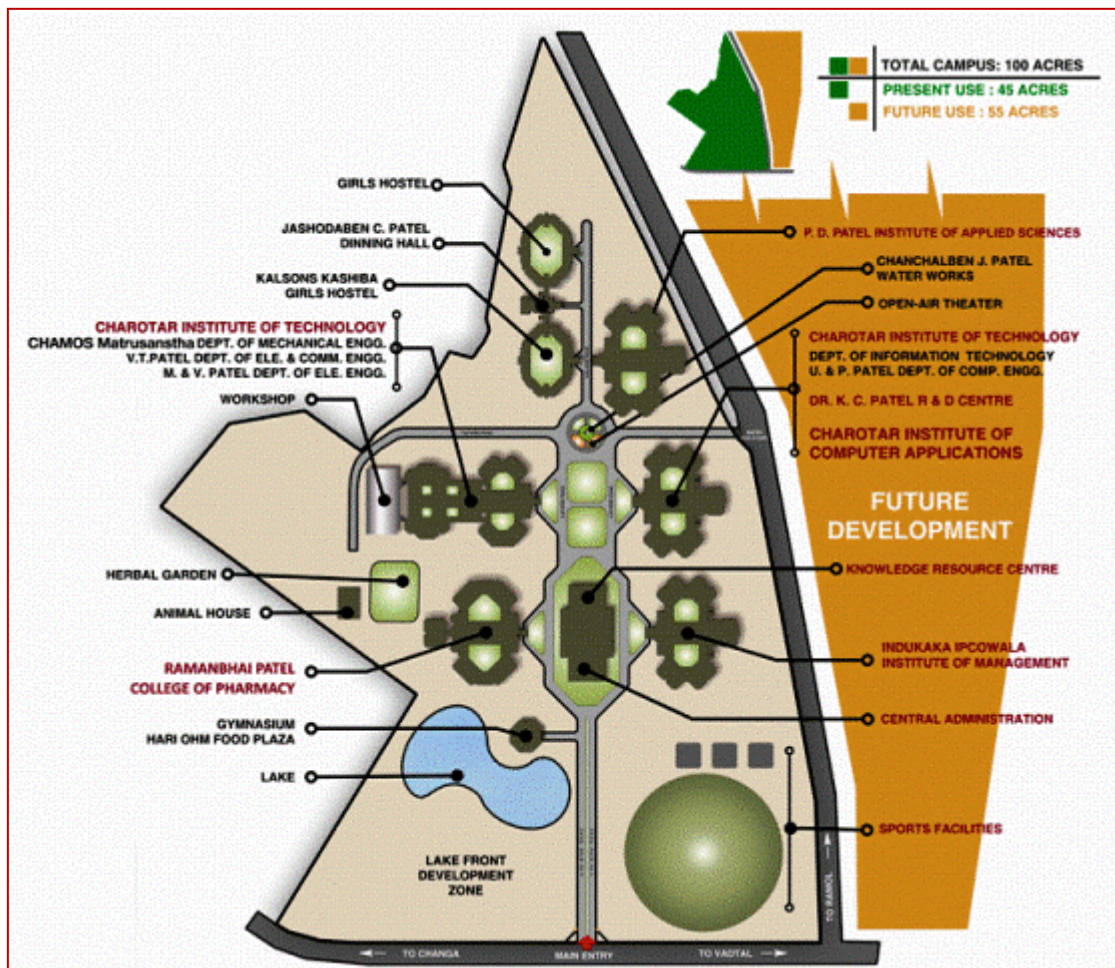
